Sermon: Trading In Our Lives

Text: Jeremiah 2:1–13

God reminds Israel of His goodness—how He led them, provided for them, protected them, and brought them into a land of blessing. Yet somewhere along the way, they traded the fountain of living water for broken cisterns that could never satisfy. Jeremiah's message is both a warning and an invitation: don't trade God's goodness for things that cannot give life.

1 – Open/Check-In

What is something you once enjoyed a great deal but gradually lost interest in over time? What changed?

2 – The Word / Jeremiah 2:1–13

What stands out to you in these passages?

3 – Reflect

1. Which best describes where you are today?
 - (a) Drinking deeply from God's fountain
 - (b) Running back and forth between the fountain and a cistern
 - (c) Trying to make a broken cistern work
 - (d) Realizing again that only God truly satisfies
2. Jeremiah says God's people committed two evils:
 - They forsook the fountain of living water.
 - They dug broken cisterns for themselves.Why do you think both of those actions matter?

4 – Respond (Spiritual Formation/Growth)

1. The sermon noted that we often dig cisterns "one shovel at a time." What small habit or choice helps keep you connected to the fountain of living water instead?

5 – Pray Together

Pray for discernment to recognize broken cisterns in your life and for a renewed hunger for the living water that only Jesus provides.

Let's be a people who refuse to trade God's goodness for lesser things, and who keep returning to the Fountain of Living Water.
